

Now Hiring: Clinical Supervisor (Independent Contractor)

Center for Domestic Peace is seeking a licensed Clinical Supervisor to support trauma-informed behavioral health services for survivors of domestic violence and their children through our Children, Youth and Community Prevention Division.

About the Opportunity

This part-time independent contractor role provides clinical supervision, consultation, and quality support for therapists, associate clinicians, and graduate-level clinical interns. The Clinical Supervisor will help strengthen C4DP's individual and family therapy services and the clinical components of **Healing Forward**, an early intervention behavioral health program serving survivors across Marin County.

The contractor will use independent professional judgment while coordinating with C4DP staff to support high-quality, survivor-centered care. This role is primarily supervisory and consultative and is not expected to carry a routine direct service caseload.

Key Responsibilities

- Provide individual and/or group clinical supervision to therapists, associate clinicians, and graduate-level interns in accordance with California Board of Behavioral Sciences requirements.
- Support trauma-informed clinical implementation of Healing Forward services for adults, children, and families impacted by domestic violence.
- Offer consultation on screening, assessment, therapy approaches, safety, risk, confidentiality, referrals, and level-of-care decisions.
- Contribute to clinical protocols, supervision frameworks, documentation practices, and quality improvement efforts.

- Help strengthen C4DP's clinical internship program and training pipeline.
- Collaborate with CYCP leadership, multidisciplinary staff, and community partners to support coordinated, culturally responsive care.

Qualifications

- Active California licensure as an LCSW, LMFT, or LPCC.
- Minimum of 5 years of post-licensure clinical experience.
- Experience providing supervision to clinicians and/or interns.
- Meets California Board of Behavioral Sciences requirements to provide clinical supervision to associate clinicians and trainees.
- Experience working with survivors of domestic violence, trauma, and/or family systems.
- Knowledge of evidence-based and community-defined trauma-informed practices.
- Strong clinical judgment, communication, consultation, documentation, and quality assurance skills.
- Commitment to survivor-centered, culturally responsive, equity-focused practice.
- Familiarity with Marin County behavioral health systems and resources preferred.
