WHY DO VICTIMS STAY IN ABUSIVE RELATIONSHIPS?

- 1. <u>To be safe</u> TO STAY ALIVE
- 2. <u>Economic dependence</u> "Who will support me and the children?"
- 3. <u>Parenting</u> "An unsafe parent is still better than no parent."
- 4. <u>Religious</u> and family pressure to keep the family together.
- Security Fear of being alone or that they can't cope with the children and manage the home by themself.
- <u>Loyalty</u> "They are sick. If they had a broken leg or had cancer I would stay with them; this is no different."
- 7. <u>Pity</u> "They are so much worse off than I am."
- 8. <u>"Savior Complex"</u> "If I stay, I can help them get better."
- Fear of his suicide "They says they will kill themself if I leave."
- 10. <u>Denial</u> "It's not really so bad."
- 11. <u>Love</u> "I love them. When they are not being abusive, they are quite loving and lovable."
- 12. <u>Duty</u> "I said I'd stay married to them 'until death do us part'."
- <u>Guilt</u> "They say the marital problems are my fault and that I caused their problems. I believe them."
- 14. <u>Responsibility</u> "Many people feel it is my responsibility to keep the marriage together emotionally, and their responsibility is financial. I believe it."
- 15. Shame, embarrassment, humiliation "I don't want anyone to know."
- Identity "I need a partner to feel complete."
- 17. Optimism "Things will get better."
